- Joel Ingram, works with Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, Habitat biologist for WRIA 1, works with most of Whatcom County, does permit related work for water related projects, works in forest practice arena, critical areas, river & flood, most of work product in fish related projects, familiar with PHS program
- John McLaughlin, wildlife ecologist and population biologist, professor at WWU, wildlife research, has worked with butterflies, amphibians/reptiles, forest carnivores, Ph.D Biological Science Population Biology
- Mark Personius, Assistant Director, Whatcom County Planning and Development Services
- Wendy Harris, retired federal attorney, previously served on Futurewise Whatcom board, citizen
  member of Critical Areas Ordinance committee, active participant in county/city public planning

## Discussion of Wildlife and WAC related topics

Other tribes from the Point Elliot Treaty should be made aware of the committee's activities, staff will work with Mr. Bob to determine best way to do this

Tribes from Point Elliot Treaty meet 3 to 4 times per year to discuss elk herd management, and other wildlife management strategies/issues

Northwest Indian Fish Commission is in constant contact with all tribes in the state.

Review DRAFT Business Rules and Procedures

Draft business rules and procedures provided were modified from Agricultural Advisory Committee Business Rules and Procedures, discussion of inclusion of reference of Robert's Rules.

Is it a possibility for alternates to participate and vote if a committee member is unable to attend?

Committee discusses business rules and procedures to understand what is or isn't required, Committee members offer recommended changes

Discussion of what constitutes quorum, committee agreed upon majority of total committee membership (6 out of 11) must vote in favor of a motion in order to carry

Discussion of when/how public can comment during committee meetings outside of initial public comment period. It was discussed that the chairperson, at his or her discretion, may call on a member of the public at any point during the committee meeting.

Review Ordinance 2015-031 to better understand committee work product and discuss how committee will go about fulfilling the tasks laid out in the ordinance. Discussion of what studies/activities/reports already exists in the County, challenges associated with characterization studies, etc.

Welcome and discussion from Councilmember Barry Buchanan. Councilmember Buchanan offered his thanks for committee members and looked forward to hearing from the committee as they work on the Existing Ecosystem Report.

Welcome and discussion from Councilmember Rud Browne. Councilmember Browne engaged the committee members on the work of the committee.

Discussion continues on how the Existing Ecosystem Report will benefit Council and Whatcom County, discussion of reasonable outcomes for the committee.

Wendy Harris brought up legal responsibility especially with regards to the Growth Management Act and local governments' requirement to protect ecosystem values. Discussion of GMA and planning for growth occurred and Ms. Harris noted the requirement to adhere to Critical Areas ordinance and the responsibility to protect ecosystem services and functions first.

Discussion of difference between full committee and technical sub-committee. Wendy Harris requested being allowed to join the Technical Sub-Committee. Staff explained that Council had already made those selections and that the committee does not have the power to appoint additional technical sub-committee members. Committee members discussed technical qualifications that could explain difference between technical and regular committee members.
